## Another Reminder! We <u>now</u> take credit and debit cards!

Claremont Senior Center is now accepting debit and credit cards for payment. However, we need to let everyone know there is a cost associated with the transaction. We charge a service fee to cover the fees and processing, as are many businesses and even the city. Our fee is less than 5%, and is added to the cost incurred. So, if you wish to use a credit card to pay your annual dues, the cost will be \$20 for the dues, plus the service fee. We can also take the information by mail or over the phone. 




## 211 is the number to dial when you need help or don't know where to call.
